

Lower School Summer Learning

Entering Kindergarten

Summer is a great time for children to take a break from a formal learning structure, but it is never good for anyone to take a break from learning. Our hope is that you approach the summer with the goals of fostering your child's love of learning and creating opportunities for growth and discovery in your child. Our goal is that you take advantage of the special summer days to encourage your child's curiosity, creativity, reading, and growth.

- Tours of museums and historical sites
- Games (educational, board, puzzles, outdoor...)
- Vacation Bible School or other faith-based opportunities
- Building a project or creating something fun
- Learn a new skill (swimming, sewing, sport, etc.)
- Outdoor adventures (nature treasure hunt, hiking, start an insect collection...)
- Keep a summer journal
- Create a photo album or scrapbook

To assist with kindergarten readiness, we suggest the following:

- Schoolzone: Get Ready for Kindergarten workbook (available on Amazon.)
- Flashcards: alphabet letters (capitals and lowercase) and numbers through 20
- Name writing on a baseline with first letter capitalized, all others lowercase
- Holding up fingers for numbers 0 − 10
- Coloring within the lines in a coloring book
- Eating lunch independently in a seated position at a table in about 20 minutes

Students are encouraged to read (with a parent) **ten books.** A variety of authors should be chosen. The following list of books and authors are suggestions. You may read other books not on this list.
